Advisory Committee Recommendations		 ED Walters presented the letter of recommendation submitted by the Advisory Committee. The letter provides recommendations on best practices on handling sensitive issues.
SAMRU Divestment Proposal	Motion: to direct ED Walters with the support of the Governance Coach to work with the authors of the divestment proposal to determine the root issues which led to its creation. Ha/Baldonado Carried	Governor Baldando presented a proposal on SAMRU Divestment Governor Castillo asked if there is any precedent at any other Student Association or Post-Secondary Institution in Canada that has successfully divested? Multiple governors requested additional research and data to be provided. The sources cited in the proposal do not meet the academic standard expected by these governors. Governor Hernandez-Alarcon disagreed with the proposal and its effectiveness given the complexity of capital markets; also warned of a 'slippery slope' for pick and choosing issues Some governors requested academic support in gathering or receiving more information to inform any potential further development of the proposal. Governor Tran shared the opinion that the intent of broad statements or directives of the board can be lost over time. The board was encouraged to ensure they are being specific with their directives. Governor Baldando asked if they can receive support from SAMRU staff in further developing this proposal. ED Walters shared that the SGB has access to the resources of SAMRU and support from staff can be provided if formally requested by the SGB. REC President Abu Hayyaneh discussed the risks that can come from making public statements. She highlighted that SAMRU should ensure that students and their needs are central in any statements made. Governor Baldanado recommended that any recommendations or directives made to the REC should



	be broad so they can be interpreted by the REC to decide how to take specific action(s). Governor San Jose stated concern of the potential negative impacts to students if the proposal is not amended with support from staff or other professional support. Governor Khan shared the opinion that there could be reputational benefits from the proposal if some students feel the proposal represents their opinions on the matter. Governor Castillo suggested that potentially SAMRU could engage in qualitative research to gain clarity on the student opinion on this matter. REC President Abu Hayyaneh shared concern about whether or not the proposal supports SAMRU's mandate. Governor GiVogue shared the opinion that SAMRU should focus on what it can do to support its members. Suggestions provided include: additional promotion of SAMRU support services, promotion of supports outside of SAMRU, or expanding existing services if needed. ED Walters shared concerns regarding the proposal including: no articulation of the problem the proposal is trying to address; issues of using SAMRU as a tool and platform for social activism and the slippery slope of causes; SAMRU's purpose and potential for mission drift; SAMRU-supported alternatives for students to engage in social activism (clubs); negative impacts and implications of the proposed changes to the investment portfolio structure; the porposal's scope and arbitrary approach determining what investments would be allowed or not
